I. GENERAL COURTS MARTIAL.—By direction of the President, the commanding officer, 7906 EUCOM Detachment, is empowered, pursuant to the eighth article of war, to appoint general courts martial, effective as of 1 January 1950.

II. ARMY FIELD PRINTING PLANT, FORT McPHERSON, GEORGIA.—Effective as of 1 January 1950, the Adjutant General, Army Field Printing Plant, Third Army Area, a class II activity under control of The Adjutant General, was discontinued. The functions and responsibilities are transferred to the Commanding General, Third Army.

III. CAMERON STATION, ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA.—Effective as of 1 January 1950, the Washington Quartermaster Depot, Alexandria, Virginia, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Quartermaster General, was redesignated Cameron Station, Alexandria, Virginia, a class I installation under the jurisdiction of the Military District of Washington.

IV. ENGINEER AVIATION UNIT TRAINING CENTER, CAMP GORDON, GEORGIA.—Effective 10 January 1950, the Engineer Aviation Unit Training Center, Camp Gordon, Georgia, will be discontinued.

V. HARBOR DEFENSES.—1. Effective as of 1 January 1950, the following harbor defenses were discontinued:

a. Harbor Defenses of Boston, Massachusetts. Fort Banks, Massachusetts, and Fort Dawes, Massachusetts, will remain class I installations under the control of the Commanding General, First Army.

b. Harbor Defenses of Narragansett Bay, Rhode Island.

c. Harbor Defenses of New York, New York. Fort Wadsworth and Fort Hancock will remain class I installations under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, First Army, with Miller Field, New York, as a subinstallation of Fort Wadsworth. Fort Tilden, New York, was designated a subinstallation of Fort Totten, New York.

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d. Harbor Defenses of Portland, Maine, and the Harbor Defenses of Portsmouth, New Hampshire, a subharbor defense of the Harbor Defenses of Portland, Maine. Fort Williams, Maine, and Fort Preble, Maine, will remain class I installations under the control of the Commanding General, First Army.

e. Harbor Defenses of Chesapeake Bay, Virginia. Fort Story, Virginia, will remain a subinstallation of Fort Eustis, Virginia, a class II installation under the control of the Chief of Transportation.

f. Harbor Defenses of Delaware, Delaware. Fort Miles, Delaware, will remain a class I installation under the control of the Commanding General, Second Army.

g. Harbor Defenses of Los Angeles, California. Fort MacArthur, California, will remain a class I installation under the control of the Commanding General, Sixth Army.

h. Harbor Defenses of San Diego, California. Fort Rosecrans, California, will remain a subinstallation of Fort MacArthur, California.

i. Harbor Defenses of Puget Sound, Washington. Fort Worden, Washington, will remain a class I installation under the control of the Commanding General, Sixth Army, with Fort Flagler and Fort Casey as subinstallations.

j. Harbor Defenses of San Francisco, California. Fort Winfield Scott, California, Fort Baker, California, Fort Barry, California, Fort Cronkhite, California, and Fort Miley, California, will remain subinstallations of the Presidio of San Francisco, California.

2. *Effective as of 31 December 1949*, Fort H. G. Wright, Fishers Island, New York, and Camp Hero, Montauk Point, Long Island, New York, a subinstallation of Fort H. G. Wright, are excess to the needs of the Department of the Army.

3. Physical examination required for promotion.—All officers listed above are required to take a physical examination in order to qualify for promotion as provided in C 7, AR 40-100. Reports of physical examinations prepared on Standard Form 88 (Report of Medical Examination) will be forwarded to the Surgeon General, Department of the Army, Attention: MEDDP, as soon as completed and in any event in time to reach that office not later than 15 February 1950. The forwarding communication will state specifically that the report is furnished in connection with promotion in the Regular Army.
