#### X-FRENCH CROIX DE GUERRE WITH SILVER STAR.

So much of paragraph 4, Section II, General Orders 43, Headquarters, Department of the Army, Washington, DC, 19 December 1950, pertaining to the citation for the award of the French Croix de Guerre with Silver Star to the 51st Engineer Combat Battalion, is amended to read as follows: "An elite unit which particularly distinguished itself during the German offensive in the Ardennes. Thrown into the Breach with the mission of containing the enemy advance on the Ligneuville-Stavelot Trois Ponts axis, it, during the period from 17 to 22 December 1944, despite the lack of heavy weapons and although attacked by an adversary very superior in number, held the positions which had been assigned to it, demonstrating proof of admirable qualities of courage and military discipline."
